As a Romantic landscape park, Prince Pueckler Park Bad Muskau (Fürst-Pückler-Park) portrays the maximum contrast to the Baroque geometry of courtly landscape gardening. Today, the spacious UNESCO world heritage site is a symbol of European integration, since two thirds of the park area are on Polish soil whereas one third is in Germany. Muskauer Park offers a unique experience of nature: broad meadows overlooked by majestic trees linked by winding paths and meandering rivers, interspersed with picturesque lakes, fascinating buildings and elegant bridges. Visitors to Muskauer Park are walking around a work of art. The park's creator, Hermann von Pückler-Muskau, called his work "painting with nature." Instead of paint and brushes, he used trees, hills, meadows and rivers. Paths and tracks lead the visitor to his best pictures, all of which have a story to tell. The New Palace in the heart of the park, which burned down completely in World War II, has been almost fully restored. It now houses the exhibition "Pueckler! Pueckler? Simply Unbelievable!"

The excursion will be in English.

Each participant will receive a packed lunch during the bus ride.
